PHILOSOPHY

PHILOSOPHY is a broad and fascinating field of study that focuses on exploring the fundamental questions of life and existence. It provides students with the opportunity to engage in deep and critical thinking about a wide range of topics, including ethics, metaphysics, epistemology, and the nature of reality.



Studies in philosophy offer a comprehensive education in the history of ideas, from ancient Greek and Roman philosophers to contemporary thinkers. You will learn about the various schools of thought and their approaches to solving some of life's biggest questions. You will also gain a strong understanding of logic and critical thinking skills, which will serve you well in any career or pursuit.


The study of philosophy provides students with a unique perspective on the world and helps them develop their own ideas and beliefs. By engaging with the works of great philosophers, students are challenged to examine their own beliefs and worldviews, which can lead to greater self-awareness and a more nuanced understanding of the world.

The skills and knowledge gained from a philosophy degree can be applied to a wide range of careers, including law, education, journalism, and government, to name just a few. In addition, many graduates go on to further study in areas such as law, psychology, or religious studies.

The undergraduate studies programme within our department is fully compatible with both the Polish and Vatican regulations regarding first-cycle studies. However, it also contains elements that are unique to our faculty. Studies last for three years (six semesters) and are organized so that the student makes consequential steps towards the desired learning outcomes: a solid base of philosophical knowledge, and the development of typical philosophical skills and competencies, including:

- critical thinking
- · intellectual independence
- the readiness for instant development
- flexible thinking
- the ability to develop non-standard solutions
- methods for an effective organization of work and tasks
- argumentation based on reason
- resistance to manipulation

Classes include lectures, seminars, and discussions. All of these are delivered entirely in English and are conducted in a cozy atmosphere with an emphasis placed on providing high-quality educa



tion. Learning outcomes are verified by assessments. In most cases, these are oral exams or essays. They may also take place in seminars, where the student's participation is the subject of assessment. Students have the opportunity to work both in groups and individually with their teachers. Each of our students is treated as a unique individual with genuine needs and their own path of development. We also endeavor to organize studies so that our students are able to work and study, or study another field simultaneously.

Studies in English are paid. The tuition fee is 4 300PLN/1000 EUR per semester. There are some minor additional costs to be covered, such as the recruitment fee and the student's ID card cost.

Discussion classes are a unique chance to gather the students of all years together for a fruitful exchange of thoughts. Potential discussion classes are: Seminar on Metaphysics / Seminar on Ethics / Seminar on the Philosophy of Nature / Seminar on Epistemology / Seminar on Logic / Seminar on Philosophical Anthropology / Seminar on Political Philosophy / Seminar on the History of Philosophy.
